

**MINUTES**  
**Special Called Meeting**  
**Monday, July 27, 2020**  
**8:00PM, Temple Senior Center**

**Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order at 8:00PM. All Council Members were present.

**Approve published agenda of this date's City Council Meeting, as presented:** There was a motion to approve the published agenda by Council Member Walden, second by Council Member Bracknell. Vote 5-0.

1. Review key points from the discussions in the July 13 regular monthly meeting of the Temple City Council and in the July 27 meeting of the City Council Budget and Finance Committee concerning the operation of the City's garbage collection and disposal program through a contract with Waste Pro USA, including residential recycling services, the rate increase implemented by Waste Pro in accordance with the three-year agreement, the City's revenues and expenditures for garbage services, and a possible increase in the City's charges for these services during the 12-month period ending June 30, 2021. This topic was discussed at previous meeting. There was a brief review and discussion of the contract the City has with Waste Pro, including an explanation of the rate increase implemented by Waste Pro in accordance with the three year agreement.

2. Adopt a resolution to establish the rates for residential and commercial garbage collection and disposal services in the City of Temple for the period of July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021. There was a motion by Council Member Walden to adopt a resolution to establish the rates for residential and commercial garbage collection and disposal, second by Council Member Bivins. Vote 5-0.

3. Review and discuss the July 13 decision by the City Council to purchase a van for the City's Senior Center, decide whether to affirm the previous action of July 13 to purchase a particular make and model for delivery in several weeks at the stated price of \$20,488 from Alan Vigil Ford or to rescind that City Council action and then approve the purchase of the same or a different make and model from a van selected on July 13 and from a buyer to be named in the motion to made during this July 27 meeting. The original vehicle that was selected to be purchased was going to take several weeks to be delivered. There was a discussion of alternative options that would meet the needs of the Senior Center and be delivered without a wait. There was a motion by Council Member Bracknell to rescind the July 13<sup>th</sup> action to purchase a vehicle, second by Council Member Miller. Vote 5-0. There was a motion by Council Member Bracknell to purchase a 2020 Ford Escape off the lot at Alan Vigil Ford, in the amount of \$22,818, with the funds coming from 2015 SPLOST, second by Council Member Miller. Vote 5-0.

4. Authorize the City of Temple to sign an agreement with a qualified certified public accountant or a CPA firm to provide additional services while working with the City Finance Director in preparing information for review by the CPA firm of Mauldin & Jenkins in conjunction with its preparation of the City's 2019 Audit and the completion of the City's 2018 Audit. After a brief discussion about the need for assistance in preparing information for the 2019 audit and completion of the 2018 audit, there was a motion by Council Member Bracknell to authorize the development of a contract with Rick Hartley with the approval of the contract of his services to be approved Monday night, second by Council Member Wallace. Vote 5-0.

5. Consider approval of a salary increase for the Temple Police Chief

There was a motion by Council Member Bracknell to add \$5,200 a year to the Police Chief's salary, second by Council Member Miller. Vote 5-0.

Executive Session, if Needed – N/a

Adjournment – There was a motion to adjourn by Council Member Bracknell, second by Council Member Walden. Vote 5-0. The meeting adjourned at 8:15PM.
